Ba 79-30 DETAILS: The following investigation was conducted by the writer. ALLEN T. HOLSING, Army serial # 33956856 was interviewed by the writer at his home 4011 Caphlyn Avenue, Baltimore, Md. He advised that he had served with the 27th Constabulary Squadron, Scheinfurt, Germany from June 1947 to July 1948. During that time he was a member of the regimental football and hockey teams and because of this was placed on special regimental duties from September 1947 until April 1948 and traveled to various places in Europe playing other Service teams. From April 1948 to the time of his discharge HOLSING made war criminal runs and would be away from camp for five days a week. Because of these activities HOLSING was not too well acquainted with the 27th Constabulary Personnel. He did recognize the picture of RICHARD-COX and remembered him to be a member of that organization but stated that he had no more than a speaking acquaintance with him and in fact did not remember what date COX left the squadron to return to the states. He did recall, however, That COX was appointed to the Military Academy. HOLSING further informed that he did not know the iden- $^{\mathrm{b6}}_{\mathrm{b7C}}$ fity of any of COM's associates in Germany male or female, GI or civilian. He further claimed that he had no idea who the \_\_\_\_ in question could be or who might have bragged to COK about mutilating bodies of German soldiers and hanging their frauleins. HOLSING maintained that he had not seen or heard from COX since he left the squadron nor did he read anything in the newspapers concerning the disappearance of COX. HOLSING advised that he was discharged from the army at Camp Kilmer, New Jersey on August 19, 1943 and returned immediately to Baltimore. He has been working for the Bakard Tile Company, 2920 Pinewood Avenue, Baltimore, Maryland since his discharge. HOLSING stated that he had never been to West Point, New York and in fact has been no further away from Baltimore, Maryland than Washington, D.C. and Ocean City, Maryland since his separation from the army. The rollowing investigation was conducted by JA WILLIAM R. IMES at Ft. George G. Meade, Maryland. - 2 -

**b**6 b7C Corporal Battery B. 4th AAA Battalion, advised that he had joined the 27th Constabular Squadron at Scheinfurt, Germany, some time in the last part of August, 1947. About two days later he had been sent to attend the Radio Operators School at Ansvach, Germany. This school lasted approximately eight weeks, and when he returned to his squadron, it had been re-designated the 28th Constabulary Squadron. about two weeks after he return be According to to the squadron, two members of the squadron left and he heard that they were going to attend the Military Academy at West Point, He stated that one of these soldiers had been named COX and one, MILLER (first names unknown to him). He claimed that he had not known either one of these soldiers very well because of the brief period that he himself had actually been around the squadron. He also maintained that he had not heard from, or of, either of these two soldiers since they had left the squadron. He advised that he had not read anything in the papers concerning the disappearance of COX. Relative to MILLER, it was his recollec tion that MILLER had a T/5 rating and was the troop clerk. further informed that he did not know the identity of any of the associates of COX in Germany, male or femal **b**6 GI or civilian, other than one FRANCIS CAFFERTY (exact last name b7C unknown). It was his recollection that this individual was from Boston and had married a Polish girl. claimed that he had no idea who the \_\_\_\_\_ in question could be, nor did he have claimed that he any idea who might have bragged to COX about mutilating bodies of German soldiers and hanging their frauleins. claimed that he himself had never been to West Point. He advised that he had come to Fort Meade with his outfit around the middle of December, 1949, from Fort Bliss, Texas b7c He had secured Christmas leave but had been back at Ft. Meade prior to New Year's Day, 1950. He went on to state that he had been at Fort Meade during the entire month of January and had had no leave of any kind during that month.

Captain YARBOROUGH checked his records and advised that according to these records, was not on leave of any b6 kind on January 7th or January 14, 1950. He also advised that b7C | had not possessed a Class A pass, and while free to come and go about the Post as he pleased during off day hours, he was not supposed to leave the Post without a pass. Captain YARBOROUGH also checked the Company's sign-out book and advised that had not signed out on the week-ends in question. He stated that he had no doubt but members of b6 the Battery left the Post without signing out and without proper pass, but he did not feel that would have taken the chance of going as far as West Point without some kind of pass in his possession.

A check of service record and allied paper by Captain YARBOROUGH reflected that had joined the l4th Constabulary Regiment in Germany on 10/8/46. On 9/3/47 while assigned to D Troop, 27th Constabulary Squadron, he had left to attend the European Command Signal School at Ansvach, Germany. The date that had joined Troop D was not indicated in the records.

The records further reflect that he completed this school, and on 11/8/47 returned to the 28th Constabulary Squadron

ME #79-22 the 27th Constabulary Squadron and with Troop D of the 28th Constabulary Squadron continuously from 1945 until December of 1947, at which time the outfit was deactivated. He said he remembered COX very well; however, about the only thing he could remember about COX was that he was very quiet and was immediately under a Technical Sergeant by the name of GOODWIN (phonetic) from some Southern state, who was very friendly with COX. JONES said that, as well as he could remember, there were two boys in this outfit who went to West Point. The following investigation was conducted by SA ARTHUR F. HODGENS.

#### AT SYRACUSE: NEW YORK

Mr. ALBERT A. DIRENZO, 220 Shonnard Street, advised that during the time he was stationed in Germany, he made the acquaintance of RICHARD COLVIN COX when they were both playing on a United States Army basketball team. As near as he could recall, he stated that his friendship with COX began in November, 1947 and lasted through February, 1948, at which time COX together with AL KARGE, were transferred from the American Army of Occupation in Germany to the United States for the purpose of receiving a discharge. He said that while he was acquainted with COX, he was not what you would call a close personal friend. He said that he did have some conversations with COX and from these conversations, recalled that COX had made it plain that on his return to civilian life he intended to try to secure an appointment to the United States Military Academy at West Point, N.Y. DIRENZO was unaware that COX had, in fact, received an appointment. He was also unaware of COX's disappearance.

DIRENZO also pointed out that during the time of COX's stay in Germany, that his close personal friend was DONALD D. DWIGANS. DIRENZO was of the opinion that if anybody knew the present whereabouts of COX, DWIGANS would be sure to, in view of his close association with the missing person.

ALBERT DIRENZO said that following COX's departure for the United States, he had no further contact with him. DIRENZO stated that he had not communicated with COX in any way nor had he ever heard of him following his departure from Germany. He was unable to furnish the names of associates of COX, other than those set forth in referenced report.

Details concerning the individual named were made available to DIRENZO and he advised that he was unable to identify the individual whose given name was as stated.

#### AT HOGANSBURG, NEW YORK

ALBERT J. COOK, Box 37, an employee of the Aluminum of America, Massena, N.Y., in interview, stated he was a member of the 27th and 28th Constabulary Squadron in Germany from September, 1946 to January 22, 1949. Mr. COOK said that he remembered a fellow slightly whose name was COX,

#### AT ELSMERE, NEW YORK

BARBARA MANNING, 72 Salisbury Road, was interviewed at her home, relative to the subject. Miss MANNING stated that she had not known the subject very long as she had only seen him on two or three occasions, when she attended a football game and hop during the week of October 22, 1949. She had been invited to attend this athletic event and social occasion as a guest of the subject. Miss MANNING states she had first met the subject in July, 1949 at Camp Buckner. Miss MANNING stated that the only social engagements she had with the subject were as follows and in this sequence: A dinner, football game, the hop and another dinner.

Miss MANNING stated that the subject, CCX, had expressed no intention of leaving West Point and that she believed he had every intention of finishing there. She stated that she did not have any knowledge of his present whereabouts and knew of no person who might have such knowledge. Miss MANNING stated that she considered the subject emotionally normal, a nice boy who is honest and reliable, and she believed he would have taken the right steps if he had intended to leave lest Point and would not have run away from any responsibility. Miss MANNING stated she does not know of any acquaintances of the subject, because on the occasion when she was his guest, she was not introduced to any other cadets. She does not know anyone named

#### PURPOSE:

To advise that Congressman J. Harry McGregor, 17th District of Ohio by letter dated January 18, 1951, requested he be informed of any developments in the case of Cadet Richard Colvin Cox who disappeared on January 14, 1950. There are no leads to Cadet Cox's present whereabouts, nor has the reason for his disappearance been developed. The reply to Congressman McGregor and his incoming letter are attached.

#### BACKGROUND:

Cadet Richard Colvin Cox disappeared from the grounds of the U. S. Military Academy, West Point, New York, on the evening of January 14, 1950. Cox was last seen in his room at which time he was in full dress uniform and indicated he was going to have dinner at the Thayer Hotel at West Point with a man who had also visited him on the previous weekend of January 7, 1950. The only information developed concerning this individual is that he was named lacksquare and that Cadet Cox had told his roommate that he was afraid  $_{
m b6}$ of this man and that this individual was a former G.I. whom Cox had known in Germany.

No positive information has been developed which actually placed Cadet Cox off the grounds of the military academy on the night of January 14, 1950. Cox is the youngest of five children and his family reside at Mansfield, Ohio. He bore an excellent reputation and his fiance advised they contemplated marriage as soon as regulations would permit.

#### INVESTIGATION CONDUCTED TO LOCATE COX:

The photograph and identifying data of Cadet Cox appeared in the Law Enforcement Bulletin of March, 1950. The West Point Military Academy authorities assisted by the police and use of a helicopter made a thorough search of their entire grounds without uncovering anything of value. Extensive radio and newspaper publicity developed no information concerning Cox. All of his associates at the West Point Military Academy and female acquaintances whom he dated have been interviewed without results. All former

military personnel who served with Cadet Cox when he was in the regular army are being located and interviewed in an effort to identify or to obtain any information as to the whereabouts of Cox and any reason for his leaving the academy. This latter phase of the investigation is still continuing and the results to date have been unproductive.

#### ACTION BEING TAKEN:

Former military personnel who served with Cox in the regular army are still being located and interviewed, and the New York Office has been instructed again to follow this case closely and to see that all logical leads are handled immediately by other divisions.

contact the writer. Mr. STILLWELL furnished information that WILLIAM F. HARWOOD, who had formerly been in the Armed Forces during World War II, had been killed in an automobile accident approximately two years before this interview.

Subsequently, Mrs. CHARLOTTE HARWOOD telephonically contacted the writer and advised that her son, who had formerly been assigned to the 27th Constabulary Squadron, Troop D, located in Germany, had been killed approximately two years prior to this interview. She stated she had never heard him mention the name of RICHARD CALVIN COX but there was a possibility that COX was known to her son. She stated he had corresponded with a couple of boys from this outfit and she would attempt to locate their names and addresses and would subsequently furnish this information to the writer.

At a subsequent date, Mrs. HARWOOD furnished information that her son had corresponded with Mr. EDWARD J. CONZERG, 307 Park Street, Medford, Massachusetts. She advised this individual had been a member of the above squadron and had corresponded regularly with her son prior to his death.

Mr. LEROY TOLAND, Route 2, Portsmouth, Ohio, receiving his mail through the Sciotoville Station, was interviewed at his home near Minford, Ohio, which is lecated on Route 2, Portsmouth. Mr. TOLAND stated that he had served a short time with the 27th Constabulary Squadron but had been transferred to other companies and outfits and had lost track of the persons known to him but that he had never known RICHARD CALVIN COX. He stated he was unable to furnish any names or addresses of persons serving with that unit while in Germany. Mr. TOLAND is presently employed by the Norfolk and Western Railroad, in the Portsmouth yards, Portsmouth, Ohio.

It is to be noted that the New York Office furnished information that WILLIAM F. HARWOOD and LEROY TOLAND were part of the enlisted personnel attached to Troop D, 27th Constabulary Squadron, July, 1947 through September, 1947 and Troop D, 28th Constabulary Squadron, September, 1947 through December, 1947, which represented the pertinent periods during which COX was assigned to these outfits.

No leads are being set out by the Cincinnati Office to interview EDWARD J. CONZERG at Medford, Massachusetts, as there is a possibility that he has already been interviewed in regard to RICHARD CALVIN COX's disappearance from West Point.



#### PURPOSE

To set forth the facts concerning the disappearance of Cadet Richard C. Cox on January 14, 1950, from the West Point Military Academy and to outline the extensive inquiries conducted to locate him. Also to advise that on January 23, 1951, the military authorities advised the Bureau that the subject is now deemed a deserter.

#### BASIS OF INQUIRIES CONCERNING COX'S DISAPPEARANCE

Cadet Richard C. Cox disappeared from the grounds of the U. S. Military Academy, West Point, New York, on the evening of January 14, 1950. Requests for assistance in locating him were received from the authorities at West Point and on February 11, 1950, Congressman J. Harry McGregor of the Seventeenth District of Ohio called Assistant Director Nichols and asked for Bureau assistance. On instructions from the Director, the New York Office was instructed to conduct inquiries and to attempt to locate the missing cadet.

#### BACKGROUND

Cadet Cox was last seen in his room at the Military Academy on the evening of January 14, 1950, at which time he was in full dress uniform and indicated that he was going to have dinner at the Thayer Hotel at West Point with a man who had also visited him on the previous week-end of January 7, 1950. The only information developed concerning this unknown individual is that he was named and that Cadet Cox had told his roommate that he was afraid of this man and that this individual was a former G.I. whom become cox had known in Germany.

Prior to Cox's entrance to the U. S. Military Academy on July 1, 1948, he served in the regular Army from September 16, 1946, to June 30, 1948. He was returned to this country from Germany where he served in the Army of occupation holding the rank of Sergeant. He attended the U. S. Military Academy Preparatory School, Stewart Field, New York, immediately prior to his admission to West Point. Cox is 22 and the youngest of five children. His family reside at Mansfield, Ohio. He bore an excellent reputation and his fiancee advised that they contemplated marriage as soon as regulations would permit.
