Dear Mr. Hoover:

On 14 January 1950 Cadet Richard C. Cox disappeared from the United States Military Academy under circumstances more indicative of coercion or foul play than of wilful absence without leave. Efforts to locate him have not been successful and the Department of the Army is much concerned.

Inclosed is a summary of the case prepared by the United States Military Academy on 3 March 1950. This swanzy indicates that the Federal Bureau of Investigation has been active in the case, but I am not aware to what extent or whether further investigation is contemplated. It is for this reason that I am writing to you.

The Department of the Army appreciates the help that the Federal Bureau of Investigation has already extended and requests your continued. cooperation in an effort to locate Cadet Cox or to determine his fate.
